

SNACK BAR ATTENDANT

Definition

Under supervision, to prepare and sell a wide variety of foods for serving in a school snack bar; do general kitchen and cafeteria work; and to do other work as required.

Essential Duties

1. Prepare and cook food and drinks for serving;
2. Assist and supervise student helpers in serving food, washing and cleaning dishes and apparatus and in cleaning a kitchen and equipment;
3. Operate a cash register and make change accurately.

Qualifications

Knowledge of:

Proper methods of preparing and cooking foods.

Ability to:

1. Follow oral and written directions;
2. Make change and keep simple records;
3. Supervise student helpers; and
4. Get along with others.

Experience:

One year experience in the preparation of food.

Education:

High school diploma or equivalent.

License:

Valid California Driver's License.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS: The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to walk and continuously required to stand. The employee will frequently bend or twist at the neck and trunk while performing the duties of this job. The employee is occasionally required to reach with hands and arms and stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. The employee is occasionally required to reach with hands and arms and repeat the same hand, arm, and finger motion many times, as in operating a cash register or cutting food items etc. The employee continuously uses hand strength to grasp tools. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds such as milk crates, frozen foods, canned food, push fully loaded food carts, etc. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, and depth perception and peripheral vision and color vision. Employees may also be required to have skin contact with detergents, abrasives and cleaning solvents and disinfectants.

WORK ENVIRONMENT: The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee occasionally works in hot and cold temperature extremes and will walk on slippery surfaces. The employee must be able to meet deadlines with severe time constraints and interact with public and other workers. The noise level in the work environment is frequently loud to where you have to raise your voice to be heard. The employee has a greater than average risk of getting a minor injury such as cut or burn while performing the duties of this job.
